Superfast Broadband

Following a recent survey of residents' views regarding the speed, volume and size of vehicles on Moor Lane, and a speed /volume survey, Rowton Parish Council asked CWaC for the following on Moor Lane:


- 1 A digital speed indication sign
- 2 Signs to advise that Moor Lane was unsuitable for HGVs
- 3 A 20 mph limit

CWaC could not endorse these requests, so Rowton Parish Council are engaging with CWaC to seek some way of improving the current situation.
