Precept

<u>Council</u>

The Parish Council still struggles to recruit Councillors and we are continuing to operate without a complete quota of Councillors. We are always looking for new Councillors so please let us know if you are interested Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

As outlined in the last Chairman's Report, Rowton Parish Council are in close contact with Christleton to ensure that any Neighbourhood Priority Statement (NPS) will be closely aligned with the Christleton Plan. The co-operation is continuing with Christleton and will result in a unified approach.

Community Bench

After nearly two years of working with the Canal and River Trust the bench has finally been installed alongside the canal.
